Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge

To promote good reading habits and literacy skills we have once again decided to participate in the Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge. Students are being encouraged to read books, from a set reading list, by 20th August 20. Grades prep to two students are required to read 30 books with some assistance from their parents. Grades three to six students will need to read 15 books mainly on their own. If students complete the requirements they get a certificate and their names published in a special supplement section in "The Age" after the challenge is completed. If you do not wish for your child's name to be published in "The Age" then please see Mrs. Hubbard.

Students are required to keep a record of the books they have read on a sheet that will be sent home. This record must be kept as proof and at a later date will be transferred onto the Vic Challenge web site. (We will do this at school) All you need to do is listen to them read and fill in the appropriate section. Books read for the challenge can also be put into their home readers.
